  - 3. Pricing:- any changes? \$25 for raffle book, \$40 for Adult night, \$5 for day
  - 4. **New course-** keep first 9 the same, and 18 in 'children's' reading room, but 10- 17 will be different. No tall stacks, more free form. I would like to get a new map for Rich (Libraryminigolf.com) and have him redesign for our review.
    - Laura to follow up with updated library map.
    - Many of the new items in the new wing and rotunda are on wheels, so can be moved around.

**New idea**: can we discuss a discount for educators in town? Incentivize teachers to be a part of the experience! Could do flyer for faculty room in schools.

Transition planning: Nominating is working on viable options for consideration Working on transition plan to be available in October/November. If any Friends would like to volunteer to head up open committees, please reach out to to Nancy G!

Response to new spaces have been overwhelmingly positive. We have noticed more interaction with the books from the children – this means more clean up for the staff, but we're thrilled to do it because it means kids are engaging with the books and the new design is working! Meeting rooms are being used throughout the day, every day. Grateful to Fran for bringing a wealth of experience and juggling the many contractors and complexities of the redesign. CLC told us that most libraries doing this kind of renovation would be closed for 3-4 months, so it's a big testament to Fran's leadership that the library was able to stay open through the majority of the process, and





to the staff to power through the construction phases! Thanks to the Friends for the ongoing support.

- Food tasting or cooking-related workshop? Something like previous tomato-tasting event at library (was someone from Natirar). Something harvest/fall-related? Fran can look into it, they are very popular and gather a lot of attendance.
